

## **True North Climbing Inc. Accessibility Compliance Policy - 2024**

### ***Statement of Organizational Commitment:***

TRUE NORTH CLIMBING, INC. (*hereafter referred to as "TNCI"*) is committed to ensuring equal access and participation for people with disabilities in all possible cases. We are committed to treating people with disabilities in a way that allows them to maintain their dignity and independence. We are committed to meeting the needs of people with disabilities in a timely manner. We will do so by removing and/or preventing barriers to accessibility and meeting our accessibility requirements under the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act and Ontario's accessibility laws.

TNCI is committed to meeting its current and ongoing obligations under the Ontario Human Rights Code respecting non-discrimination.

TNCI understands that obligations under the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005 (AODA) and its accessibility standards do not substitute or limit its obligations under the Ontario Human Rights Code or obligations to people with disabilities under any other law.

TNCI is committed to excellence in serving and providing goods, services and/or facilities to all customers including people with disabilities.

Our accessible customer service policies are consistent with the principles of independence, dignity, integration and equality of opportunity for people with disabilities.

### **Training**

We are committed to training all staff and volunteers in accessible customer service, other Ontario's accessibility standards and aspects of the Ontario Human Rights Code that relate to persons with disabilities. In addition, we will train:

- a) all persons who participate in developing TNCI's policies; and
- b) all other persons who provide goods, services or facilities on behalf of TNCI

Training of our employees and volunteers on accessibility relates to their specific roles.

Training includes:

- purpose of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005 and the requirements of the Customer Service Standards
- our policies related to the Customer Service Standards
- how to interact and communicate with people with various types of disabilities
- how to interact with people with disabilities who use an assistive device or require the assistance of a service animal or a support person

- how to use the equipment or devices available on-site or otherwise that may help with providing goods, services or facilities to people with disabilities. These include:
  - Portable ramp
  - Automatic door switches and doorstops
  - Accessible waiver forms
  - Full-body climbing harnesses
- what to do if a person with a disability is having difficulty in accessing TNCI's goods, services or facilities

We train every person as soon as practicable after being hired and provide training in respect of any changes to the policies.

We maintain records of the training provided including the dates on which the training was provided and the number of individuals to whom it was provided.

## **Assistive Devices**

People with disabilities may use their personal assistive devices when accessing our goods, services or facilities.

In cases where the assistive device presents a significant and unavoidable health or safety concern or may not be permitted for other reasons, other measures will be used to ensure the person with a disability can access our goods, services or facilities.

If the significant or unavoidable health or safety concern may be mitigated by the presence of a support person, that support person will be admitted and accommodated free of charge.

We ensure that our staff are trained and familiar with various assistive devices we have on site or that we provide that may be used by customers with disabilities while accessing our goods, services or facilities. This information is included in our instructor training.

## **Communication**

We communicate with people with disabilities in ways that take into account their disability. This may include the following:

- In-person lessons (verbal and visual communication)
- Digital communication (email newsletters, booking confirmations, etc.)

We will work with persons with disabilities to determine what method of communication works best for them.

## **Service Animals**

We welcome people with disabilities and their service animals. Service animals are allowed on the parts of our premises that are open to the public and third parties.

When we cannot easily identify that an animal is a service animal, our staff may ask for documentation (template, letter or form) from a regulated health professional that confirms the person needs the service animal for reasons relating to their disability.

A service animal can be easily identified through visual indicators, such as when it wears a harness or a vest, or when it helps the person perform certain tasks.

A regulated health professional is defined as a member of one of the following colleges:

- College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Ontario
- College of Chiropractors of Ontario
- College of Nurses of Ontario
- College of Occupational Therapists of Ontario
- College of Optometrists of Ontario
- College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario
- College of Physiotherapists of Ontario
- College of Psychologists of Ontario
- College of Registered Psychotherapists and Registered Mental Health Therapists of Ontario

## **Support Persons**

A person with a disability who is accompanied by a support person will be allowed to have that person accompany them on our premises. Admission and fees for necessary rental equipment will not be charged for support persons.

We notify customers of this by posting a notice in the following locations:

- The “Prices” and “Accessibility” pages of our website
- The price info sheets at our front desk

In certain cases, TNCI might require a person with a disability to be accompanied by a support person for the health or safety reasons of:

- the person with a disability
- others on the premises

Before making a decision, TNCI will:

- consult with the person with a disability to understand their needs
- consider health or safety reasons based on available evidence
- determine if there is no other reasonable way to protect the health or safety of the person or others on the premises

If TNCI determines that a support person is required, we will waive the admission fee or fare (if applicable) for the support person.

## **Notice of Temporary Disruption**

In the event of a planned or unexpected disruption to services or facilities for customers with disabilities, TNCI will notify customers promptly. This clearly posted notice will include information about the reason for the disruption, its anticipated length of time, and a description of alternative facilities or services, if available.

Services/Facilities include:

- Accessible washroom
- Portable ramp
- Automatic door switches and doorstops
- Accessible waiver forms
- Full-body climbing harnesses

The notice will be made publicly available in the following ways:

- The “Accessibility” page of our website

## **Feedback Process**

TNCI welcomes feedback on how we provide accessible customer service. Customer feedback will help us identify barriers and respond to concerns.

Feedback may be provided in the following ways:

- By email
- By phone call
- In person to our reception staff
- Through our in-person suggestion box

All feedback, including complaints, will be handled in the following manner:

- Feedback will be directed to the Owner and/or General Manager and/or Assistant Manager(s) of the facility
- Feedback will be discussed immediately and/or during our weekly senior staff meeting depending on the urgency of the matter
- Policy and/or process changes made in response to feedback will be communicated to all relevant staff and made available on the “Accessibility” page of our website
- Training on how to act on these changes will be provided for all relevant staff, if applicable

Customers can expect to hear back within 7 days regarding their feedback.

TNCI ensures our feedback process is accessible to people with disabilities by providing or arranging for accessible formats and communication support upon request.

## **Notice of Availability of Documents**

TNCI notifies the public that documents related to accessible customer service are available upon request by posting a notice in the following location(s)/way(s):

- The “Prices” and “Accessibility” pages of our website
- The price info sheets at our front desk

TNCI will provide these documents in an accessible format or with communication support upon request. We will consult with the person making the request to determine the suitability of the format or communication support. We will provide the accessible format in a timely manner and at no additional cost.

## **Self-service Kiosks**

We will incorporate accessibility features/consider accessibility for people with disabilities when designing, procuring or acquiring self-service kiosks.

## **Employment**

We notify employees, job applicants and the public that accommodations can be made during recruitment and hiring. We notify job applicants when they are individually selected to participate in an assessment or selection process that accommodations are available upon request. We consult with the applicants and provide or arrange for suitable accommodation.

We notify successful applicants of policies for accommodating employees with disabilities when making offers of employment.

We notify staff that supports are available for those with disabilities as soon as practicable after they begin their employment. We provide updated information to employees whenever there is a change to existing policies on the provision of job accommodation that take into account an employee’s accessibility needs due to a disability.

We will consult with employees when arranging for the provision of suitable accommodation in a manner that takes into account the accessibility needs due to disability. We will consult with the person making the request in determining the suitability of an accessible format or communication supports specifically for:

- a) information that is needed in order to perform the employee’s job; and
- b) information that is generally available to employees in the workplace

Where needed, we will also provide customized emergency information to help an employee with a disability during an emergency. With the employee's consent, we will provide workplace emergency information to a designated person who is providing assistance to that employee during an emergency.

We will provide the information as soon as practicable after we become aware of the need for accommodation due to the employee's disability.

We will review the individualized workplace emergency response information:

- a) when the employee's overall accommodations needs or plans are reviewed; and
- b) when the employer reviews its general emergency response policies.

We have a written process to develop individual accommodation plans for employees.

We have a written process for employees who have been absent from work due to a disability and require disability-related accommodations in order to return to work.

Our performance management, career development and redeployment processes take into account the accessibility needs of all employees.

## **Design of Public Spaces**

We will meet accessibility laws when building or making major changes to public spaces. Our public spaces include:

- Front desk
- Accessible washroom
- Lounge area
- Entryway and queueing area

## **Changes to Existing Policies**

Any policies of TNCI that do not respect and promote the principles of dignity, independence, integration and equal opportunity for people with disabilities will be modified or removed.
